cs | Anyone who has been to the last two Christmas Concerts will have been totally enthralled by the performances of the fabulous Colombian Soprano Julieth Lozano and she is coming back to Klosters to perform in the Chesa tomorrow with works by Granados, Dvorak, Kreisler, Saint-Saëns and Strauss. Julieth will be accompanied by two equally talented musicians, the young Swiss violinist Laia Braun and the Italian pianist Marco Scilironi.

Julieth Lozano began studying Industrial Engineering at the Universidad Javeriana in Bogotá, but who after seeing and lis-

tening to her first opera at age 19 fell in love with it, and there was no turning back. Julieth was awarded a Master in Vocal Performance and Artist diploma in opera from the Royal College of Music. She is an Irene Hanson Scholar and received the Sybil Tutton Scholarship and is currently supported by an independent opera award. In 2016 Julieth participated in Georg Solti's Academy and participated in the opera Don Giovanni where she played the role of Zerlina in the framework of the Verbier Festival where she won the Thierry Mermod Award for singers. Amongst others, she has also had

masterclasses with Dame Kiri Te Kanawa and Angela Gheorghiu and Julieth was selected as one of the young artists at the National Opera Studio in the UK for the 2019/20 season – this is like taking the biggest step of all into a fully professional career and what a fabulous and special concert to have combined with the opening of the Chesa Grischuna for the summer season!
